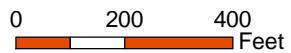


Crawley Preserve Trails

CRAWLEY PRESERVE TRAILS

Crawley Preserve hosts three well marked and well maintained trails on 99 acres straddling two towns: Richmond and South Kingstown. Most of the property (84.2 acres) falls in Richmond. Acquired in 2003 as a joint project with the Richmond Rural Land Conservation Trust and the South Kingstown Land Trust, and funded by the Town of South Kingstown and the Nature Conservancy, this is a showcase property. The trails pass through upland forest of beech, oak and the occasional white pine. Please stay on the marked trails!

Prohibited Activities:

Use of mountain bikes or motorized vehicles

Hunting, trapping and fishing

Removal of dead wood or fallen branches

Building fires, camping, remaining on the property after sunset

Leaving trash on the property

Driving directions:

From Wakefield, follow signs for RI Route 108 North (Kingstown Road). Proceed 2.4 miles to a traffic light. Turn left onto RI Route 138 (Kingstown Road). Continue 5.0 miles. Turn right onto Old Usquepaugh Road. Continue 0.1 miles then bear right to continue on Old Usquepaugh Road. After about 375 feet, stay to the right where the road forks. You are now on Glen Rock Road. Continue 0.3 mi. to parking area on left.
