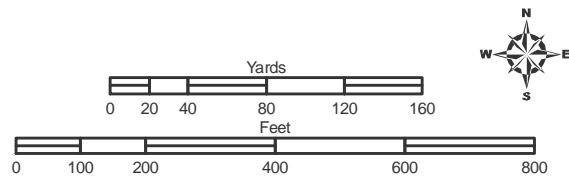

THEWLIS WOODS

Harold Thewlis donated 27 acres of wooded upland to The Nature Conservancy in May 1994. TNC then passed ownership of the property to the South Kingstown Land Trust. According to Mr Thewlis's will, SKLT holds the land without restrictions. To date, SKLT has been fortunate to be able to keep this land as open space, and been able to raise funds for land purchases and operations from other sources.

Thewlis Woods features stands of eastern white pine, scarlet oak and beech. Turkey, coyote, fisher cat and many other animals find food and shelter on this property. A hiking 0.8 mile trail built in 2006 by John Tarasevitch as an Eagle Scout project, and generously funded by the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR), gives the hiker access to this beautiful property.

Driving directions:

From the SKLT office at 313 Main Street in Wakefield (across from Robinson Street) proceed southwest on Main Street toward Route 1 for 0.71 miles to the top of the hill. Take a right onto Post Road. Go down Post Road for 0.18 miles then bear right onto Dockray Road. Proceed on Dockray for about 500 feet then take a right onto Pine Hill Road. The road takes a sharp bend to the left then climbs a small hill. Proceed for 0.32 mile. Park on the right side shoulder just before the trail sign.
