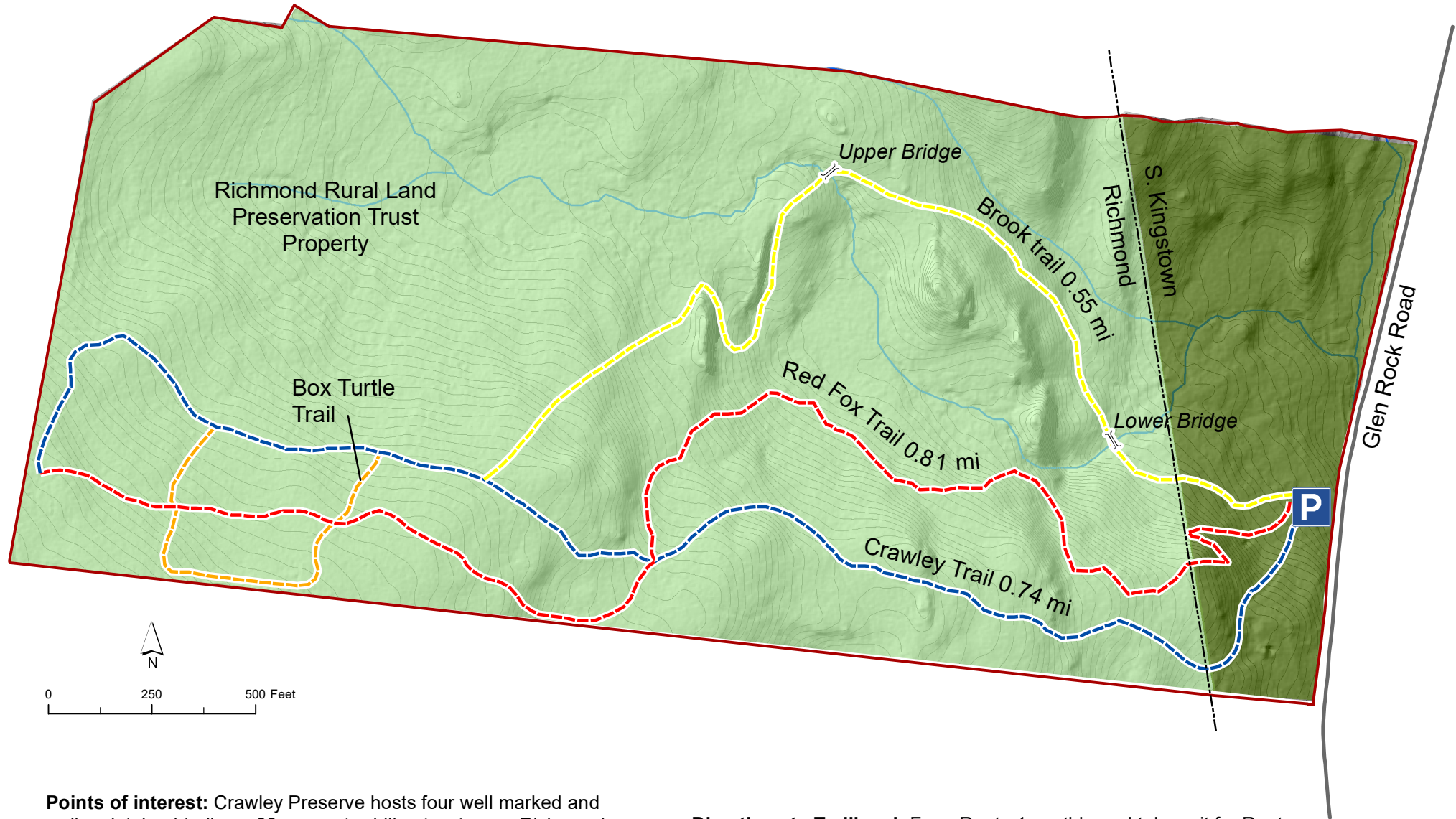


Crawley Preserve Trail



Points of interest: Crawley Preserve hosts four well marked and well maintained trails on 99 acres straddling two towns: Richmond and South Kingstown, with most of the property (84.2 acres) in Richmond. The Preserve was acquired in 2003 as a joint project of the Richmond Rural Land Conservation Trust and SKLT, and funded by the Town of South Kingstown and The Nature Conservancy. The trails pass through upland forest of beech, oak and the occasional white pine.

Directions to Trailhead: From Route 1 southbound take exit for Route 110 (Ministerial Road). Follow Ministerial Road for 5.9 miles to a at the intersection of Route 138. Make a left and continue 3.3 miles to Usquepaugh Road. Turn right onto Old Usquepaugh Road and continue 0.1 miles, passing a stone dam on the right, then bear right onto Glen Rock Road. Continue 0.3 miles to parking area on left.
